We are excited to share with you SAIL High School's 2010-2011 School Public Accountability Report, which outlines the school's accomplishments and test data. Our SPAR is available for viewing in our office or online at www.fldoe.org/eias/eiaspubs.

SAIL offers a variety of academic and artistic learning opportunities. SAIL received the College Board's 2011 Southern Regional Award for Innovation in the Arts. The SAIL Robotics Club placed 38th overall and 5th out of the 17 other rookie teams in the Orlando Regional *FIRST* (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) Competition. The drama department presented *The Crucible* and *A Midsummer Night's Dream* which both received rave reviews. Our career day was a success with support from many local businesses and post-secondary schools. The SAIL garden club sold fresh organic produce; SGA raised awareness and money for *Invisible Children* in Africa; our Bluegrass ensemble performed locally and they were "featured performers" at the Florida Folk Festival; and teachers sponsored a benefit supporting a SAIL alum battling cancer. Students also participated in Multicultural activities, a Respect Campaign, Intensives and much more.


Although High School grades will not be released until later this fall, the test portion has been released and **SAIL did a great job!**

- SAIL ranked 2nd among district high schools in Reading, both in growth and overall scores.
- SAIL ranked 1st in science with 66 % of 11th graders scoring 3 or better.
- 83% of SAIL students scored 3 or better in Math.
- Our lowest quartile Reading students made the highest gains of all the high schools in the district, a gain of 19+%.
- All 9th graders taking the Algebra 1 End of Course (EOC) exam passed.

We continue to prove that school can be safe, fun, and produce excellent academic results! Our goals for this school year include: literacy, writing, and researching across grade levels; utilizing technology integration; emphasizing art through community service; healthy decisions, wellness and fitness; going greener by recycling-composting school wide; college and career readiness; and maintaining a positive school climate.

We are extremely honored that our parents, teachers, and especially our students continue to exhibit positive collaboration with favorable results. We value and encourage your participation and input with regard to our continuing school improvement efforts. We look forward to another great school year!
